Federal and State regulations require individuals, businesses and organizations to dispose of non-working and obsolete electronic waste products in an **environmentally sound manner**. These regulations are meant to prevent selected high technology products from ending up in landfills where **toxic elements could leach into the water system**.

Computers and electronics may contain **hazardous waste elements** such as lead solder, mercury, cadmium and beryllium. Monitors, CRT's and televisions may have anywhere from 4 to 8 lbs. of lead.

Although consumers may be exempt from regulation or penalty in some areas, we encourage everyone to be environmentally conscious. Corporate and institutional clients should call Interstate Waste Services to help facilitate and coordinate turnkey electronic recycling programs.
