George Ewing of the Port Jervis Ambulance gave an update. He provided a handout on what he presented. When George took over January, 2017 the Port Jervis Ambulance was \$80,000 in the hole. He is happy to say they closed out the year \$50,000 in the positive. They are increasing the volunteer base. They have a third ambulance and got it from Watertown, New York. It is a 2008 Ambulance with 100,000 miles for \$4,500.00. They are working on fundraisers for the year. Their next Board Meeting is the upcoming Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. The next General Membership Meeting is the upcoming Friday at 7:00 or 7:30 p.m. They have been extraordinarily busy. In January, they were dispatched to 195 calls and responded to 186 of them. In four days of February, they are up to 30 calls.

Old Business

Al Fusco, Jr. of Fusco Engineering provided an update on three properties of unsafe/dangerous structures. He said that property on 2 Piatt Drive (22-1-47) and 6 Piatt Drive (22-1-45) are both in the same condition. They have two unlicensed cars and one licensed car there. They appeared to get rid of most of the cat dishes and cat litter and that appears to be a little better. His understanding is that the property is under new management or new ownership. Supervisor Spears said he received information that day from the Assessor that the county is now the owner of both properties. He said regarding the property at 1045 US Route 209 (22-1-43), Ms. Kristopherson had cleaned up a little bit, with some debris, but the windows are boarded up in the front, there is a broken window in the back and the porch is still short of precarious—a little dangerous in the back as well. All three of the properties are a little better than a year ago.

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<u>Supervisor Spears</u> preferred extending this decision out another two months due to the weather, then see if the county has actually talked to John McCarey to see if they are going to do anything.

That does not include any graffiti remediation. The Upper Delaware Council (UDC) received funding from the federal government from the National Parks Service. They have not received their stipend. It's critical for the staff. Their secretary turned in her notice, unable to wait for the money to be released. The money literally belongs to the UDC, they might survive three months and if they don't get the funding, the UDC will need to shut down.
