Closing Board Comments

<u>Supervisor Spears</u> reported on the last meeting regarding the Annexation discussion with the City of Port Jervis. They are still going forward. They had a meeting with Barton & Loguidice doing the study and in the mean time they want to set up a meeting with Port Jervis and iron out all the details regarding sharing revenue. Going forward with the study—when the public asks questions—they can define situations a whole lot better. They are checking into some questions raised by a local town attorney and adjoined properties, etc. This is not speeding along, they want to make sure it gets done properly and is beneficial for both towns. He then reported that they did purchase playground equipment and had it installed at Bigger Park in Deerpark Manor and that money came from subdivision lots where they get a \$1,000 recreation fee. They are now getting quotes for Harriet Space Park equipment and he welcomes any input.

<u>Councilman Trovei</u> thanked Gary for how hard he works and wasn't sure people knew how hard he worked. He thanked him for the conversations leading to such good results.

Councilman Schock said it was good to see Boehmler Park was being harvested. He urged everyone to pray for Dave.

Councilman Smith said their thoughts are for their friend Dave. He said Gary did a good job negotiating.
